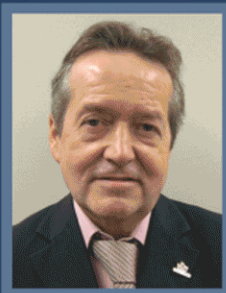
The Public Service Pension Plan: Perspectives for its Professionals

Senior research and communications officer at the National Association of Federal Retirees, on *Financial Matters*

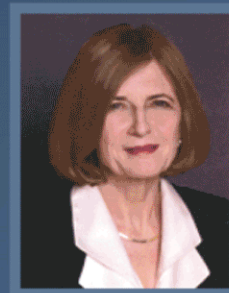
